- 3. Adjust your Standing Order: If you haven't increased your giving to St Anne's for some years, please go on-line to your bank and adjust it slightly. For instance, if 50 people increased their giving by just £5 per month, that would give St Anne's £250 a month or £3,000 in a year. This can make a big difference to us; thank you. If you have not yet set up a Standing Order, please use the form available at the back of church to enable you to instruct your bank to make a regular donation to St Anne's Church.

Remember we get no help from the national church, or government. Like every Church of England church, we are utterly dependent on local people's donations to pay our bills; it costs over £3,000 a week to run St Anne's.
