New Archbishop of Canterbury

We rejoice at the confirmation of Bishop Sarah Mullally as the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury, the first woman to take this role. Archbishop Sarah said: "These are times of division and uncertainty for our fractured world. I pray

that we will offer space to break bread together and discover what we have in common - and I pledge myself to this ministry of hospitality.

"I want us to be a Church that always listens to the voices of those who have been ignored or overlooked, among them victims and survivors of church abuse who have often been let down. I am committed to equipping the Church to be a kind and safe place that cares for everyone, especially those who are vulnerable, as we rise to the challenge of God's call to justice, equity, peace and the care of creation". Archbishop Sarah will be installed at Canterbury Cathedral in March.
