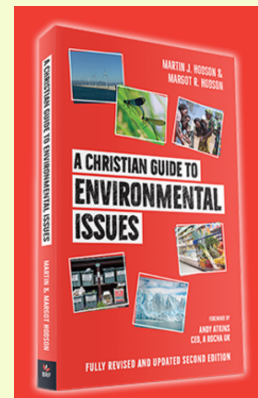
For our PCC meeting: we meet on Tuesday 22 September at 7 pm.
